

# Frequently Asked Questions

Please note, that the Legislative Subscription Service is an experimental service with the intent of keeping veterans connected to their government.

## Q. Is this a free notification/subscription service?

A. Yes, this service is provided by the Delaware Veterans Coalition to anyone interested in keeping track of Legislative Bills that affect veterans in the State of Delaware.

## Q. How do I sign up for this free notification/subscription service?

A. To sign up for the service, go to the Delaware Veterans Coalition website and click on the "Delaware Legislation" button on the left navigation. Once on the Delaware Legislation web page, select the "Subscribe" tab, then,

1. Enter your email address and click on the "Subscribe" button
  2. You will get a popup box where you will have to enter a code that is displayed (this makes sure you are human and not a computer program trying to sign up) and submit.
  3. You should receive an email with a link to verify your subscription. (If you don't see it, check your SPAM folder just in case it went there. If you can't click on the link in your email, then simply copy the link and paste it into your web address bar.)

## Q. Why was this Email Subscription Service started?

A. It was started because the Delaware Veterans Coalition believes that knowledge is power, and we must empower our veterans to make informed decisions about their elected representatives.

## Q. When will I receive the email?

A. The Emails will be delivered between 9 and 11 PM, and only when there is new information to be delivered.

## Q. Why do I see legislation more than once in my email?

A. You may see a bill more than once because there may be more than one action on a bill. For instance, you should almost always see two entries for a new piece of legislation. That is because it is first "Introduced," which is one action, and then it is assigned to a "Committee," which is a second action during the same day. You may see legislation more than once again if a bill comes "Out of Committee" and back into another committee.

## Q. Who is responsible for the legislative information (RSS Feed)?

A. The Information Technology section of the Delaware Legislature is responsible for the RSS Feeds that we use. We are simply publicizing the RSS (Real Simple Syndication) feeds provided by the Legislative website, then filtering them for legislation affecting veterans to allow veterans to track bills of interest to them.
